At MVHS, our volunteers make a difference in the lives of our patients, residents, their families and friends and they provide support for a number of departments within the organization. From greeting patients and visitors at Wynn Hospital to delivering mail at the Faxton Campus or spending time with a resident at the Rehabilitation and Nursing Center (RNC), our volunteers are an integral part of our team at MVHS.

Volunteer Stats

In 2024:

- MVHS had 63 volunteers working at various MVHS sites
- The Volunteer Association donated more than \$48,000 to MVHS
- Volunteers worked at total of 15,000 hours.
- The Pastoral Care team, most of whom are volunteers, makes approximately 1,000 rounds every month.

Did you know?

April is <u>National Volunteer Month</u>! In 1991, President George H.W. Bush launched the 1,000 Points of Light campaign and established April as National Volunteer Month. The phrase "a thousand points of light" was popularized by Bush and later formed the name of a private, nonprofit organization launched by the former president to support volunteerism.

Now known as the Points of Light, this organization is the world's largest organization dedicated to increasing volunteer service, engaging nearly 4 million volunteers across 38 countries with a mission to create healthy, equitable communities where all can thrive.


